SCOPE OF WORK AND DELIVERABLES

Scope:

The Legislative Reference Bureau is a nonpartisan legislative service agency, that provides a wide variety of services to legislators, legislative committees, and in some cases, members of the public.

The scope of this project includes the creation of two websites. One for the Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB) and one for the Public Access Room (PAR), a division of LRB. HIC will work closely with LRB and PAR to collect, develop, and design the new websites through facilitated meetings.

LRB is looking for a custom design and simplified website. The current site has been live for 15+ years and they are planning to move non LRB content off to the library catalogue so the new site will contain only LRB content. HIC will assist in the migration and planning efforts for LRB to complete this work.
