The system will include:

- Online payment for department's certification exam
- Direct Wine Shipment applications
- Permitting applications such as transient vessels

COUNTY will have access to Admin Module(s) to search and view completed applications.

Additional Benefits – Cost savings to the County; paperless process for applicants.


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Fees & Cost Structure

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Transaction Fees Breakdown

- A transaction fee of **5**%; plus
- Credit/debit card or eCheck fee:
 - 2.5% Credit/debit card fee; or
 - \$1.00 eCheck fee

Statutory Fee(s)

- Class registration fee: \$20
- Direct Wine Shipper Application: \$180
- Transient Vessel Permit: \$1200

Revenue
